A street crossing with auditory signals for the blind	Often a beep or spoken word from a crosswalk for when it is safe and unsafe to cross an intersection/street
Is the doorway accessible?	<ul> <li>Accessible doorways should be at least 32 inches wide</li> <li>Doors must not require more than 5 lbs. of force to open. It must also be operable with one hand and without tight grasping, pinching, or twisting of the wrist.         <ul> <li>Traditional round doorknobs are not accessible, as they require tight grasping and twisting to turn.</li> <li>The Pinky Rule: Try opening the door with just the power you have in one pinky!</li> </ul> </li> <li>Thresholds/lips on the ground where the door closes cannot be higher than 1/2 inch from the ground</li> </ul>

## Is the bathroom The height of the towel/toilet paper dispensers should be between 40 inches and 48 inches accessible? Sinks shouldn't be mounted higher than 34 inches from the floor, and they should have a knee clearance of 27 inches Accessible stalls or toilet rooms should include grab bars on the walls Mirror (§213.3.5) Coat Hooks and Shelves (§213.3.7) where provided at least 1 of each type where provided Dispensers and Receptacles (§205) Water Closet where provided (§213.3.2) Toilet Paper Dispenser (§604.7) Lavatory (§213.3.4) where provided Turning Space (§603.2.1) 60" diameter circle or T-turn Is the entrance accessible? If there is a ramp, it cannot be too steep or have an abrupt drop at either end • Ramp width minimum must be 36 inches Ramps should also have a landing/flat large enough for a wheelchair to turn around (60 inch circle) At least half of the entrances to a public building must have a ramp or no stairs / be accessible from the public sidewalk If the visible entrance is not accessible, there should be signs to nearest accessible entrance(s) Is the sales / service Accessible counter surface is at least 36 inches long and no counter accessible? more than 36 inches above the floor There should also be a 30 inches by 48 inches space in front of the sales or service counter Examples of these counters can be cash registers, ticket booths, library check out desks, or teller stations at banks
