

ACCESSIBILITY SCAVENGER HUNT

Have you ever thought about how accessible your surroundings are for those with disabilities? Many overlooked spaces often fail to accommodate the needs of disabled individuals. Grab a pen and paper to complete this scavenger hunt with friends and family. See how many accessible or inaccessible things you find out and about in your home, community, stores and more!

Please note that most of these clues pertain to physical disabilities.

IN YOUR HOME:

Accessible

- An accessible entrance
- An accessible bathroom
- An accessible doorway

Inaccessible

- Something too high up for someone to reach sitting down or in a wheelchair
- A space too small for a wheelchair to turn Around [60" diameter circle or T-shaped space]
- A doorway too narrow for a wheelchair

IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD:

Accessible

- A street crossing with auditory signals for the blind
- An accessible parking space
- A textured section of a sidewalk to mark danger ahead

Inaccessible

- A sidewalk that isn't wheelchair accessible, for example if there is construction or too many holes/bumps
- A curb that isn't cut
- A restaurant or business that does not have an accessible entrance

IN A BUSINESS/COMMUNITY SPACE:

Accessible

- A sign that has large print, pictures, or Braille
- A sign written in multiple languages
- Audio description signage for a video/screen

Inaccessible

- Something too high up for someone to reach sitting down or in a wheelchair
- A heavy door without an automatic door opener [use the pinky rule!]
- A doorway too narrow for a wheelchair

IN A PARK:

Accessible

- A smooth and level path
- A ramp next to a set of stairs
- A sign with the symbol of accessibility

Inaccessible

- An unmarked incline or decline
- An inaccessible public restroom
- No accessible parking

ON THE WEB:

- A disability you didn't know about before
- What TTY stands for
- A famous person with a disability
- 3 kinds of intellectual & cognitive disabilities
- 3 kinds of sensory disabilities

- 3 kinds of physical disabilities
- A movie/TV show that has a character with a disability
- Number of Americans that have disabilities
